Book Project List
For Summer Reading List, 2009

- ❖ Create a sculpture of a character. Use any combination of soap, wood, clay, sticks, wire, stones, old toy pieces, or any other object. Explain how this character fits into the book.
- ❖ Dress up as the main character of the book and present a summary of the story.
- ❖ Make a diorama of a favorite scene from the book.
- ❖ Make puppets and present a show of a scene from the book.
- ❖ Pretend you are the main character of the book. Write a letter to a friend telling him/her of all your adventures.
- ❖ For non-fiction books, create a time line of the main events in the character's life.
- ❖ Draw and label several sketches of some of the scenes in the book.
- ❖ Write a diary that one of the characters might have kept before, during, or after the book's events. Remember that feelings are very important in a diary.
- ❖ Write a book review as it is done in a magazine or newspaper.
- ❖ Write about the time period in which your book takes place. Also, discuss how your character fits into that period.
- ❖ For non-fiction books, create a poster showing scenes from the life of your main character.
- ❖ Write and perform an original song that tells the story of the book.
- ❖ Be a TV or radio reporter, and give a report of a scene from the book, as if it is happening live.
- ❖ Design a book jacket for the book. Look at some book jackets to see the type of information contained.
- ❖ Write a different ending for your story. Share a summary of the book with your class and then present your alternate ending.
- ❖ Write an essay to Compare and Contrast two characters from the book.
- ❖ Write an essay describing the change/s that occurs in your character during the course of the book.
- ❖ Present a written analysis of the literary elements of the book. For example: setting, point of view, characters, plot, and theme
- ❖ Analyze the main character of the book. Is he/she a Godly character? What traits does he/she display that prove your answer? What actions does your character make that prove your answer? Provide examples from the book.

Choose one of the above projects after reading your book. Please try to choose a project which is age appropriate...
